## Program Details

### Academics

#### AMERICAN GOVERNMENT

June 7 - 25 • 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.

The primary goal of this course is to build an understanding of the structure and workings of the United States government. This goal is fulfilled through a study of the Constitution and the three branches of the U.S. Government: Executive, Legislative and Judicial. Further, students are exposed to issues such as civil rights, civil liberties, political parties, interest groups, the media and the Pluralism/Elitism debate. This course will be taught by Molly Smith, will give the student 0.5 Upper School Credit and will be included in the student's GPA. Program cost is \$1,000 if registered by 4/15; \$1,100 if registered after 4/15.

#### DRAWING

June 7 - 25 • 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.

This course teaches students to become more visually aware of how art is a part of everything they see around them. Students learn the language of design, the principles and techniques of design and practical applications in commercial drawing. This course challenges students to be creative in solving problems of design, yet also enables them to produce visually dynamic works of art. This course will be taught by Carole Rosario, will give the student 0.5 Upper School Credit and will be included in the student's GPA. Program cost is \$1,000 if registered by 4/15; \$1,100 if registered after 4/15.

#### EXPOSITORY WRITING

June 7 - 25 • 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.

The Expository Writing course introduces students to a variety of essay forms including descriptions, narration, analysis, process, classification, definition, comparison and contrast, cause and effect and persuasion. Students engage in activities such as pre-reading, active reading, pre-writing, writing and revising of multiple drafts and peer evaluating. Each student is individually evaluated and is given specific goals to achieve before and after the course is completed. This course will be taught by Donnamarie Hehn, will give the student 0.5 Upper School Credit and will be included in the student's GPA. Program cost is \$1,000 if registered by 4/15; \$1,100 if registered after 4/15.

#### PAINTING

June 28 - July 16 • 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.

This course teaches students multiple skill levels. Students learn about various artists in history, contemporary artists, styles and methods, as well as the different types of media. Each student is encouraged to begin by sketching several compositions, then work toward final execution in watercolor, acrylic or oil. Students who have never worked with oil make smaller compositions, then increase the size of the work as they adapt to oils' unique properties. As with drawing, students apply elements and principles of design so that underlying concepts are supported in their approach. This course will be taught by Carole Rosario, will give the student 0.5 Upper School Credit and will be included in the student's GPA. Program cost is \$1,000 if registered by 4/15; \$1,100 if registered after 4/15.

## Enrichment

### DISCOVERING DIGITAL MEDIA AND PHOTOSHOP ELEMENTS

Grades 5-8

June 28 - July 2 • 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.

Campers will take pictures, manipulate their own photos and stock images and create movie presentations using the images collected during camp. Digital camera instruction including techniques for taking pictures and why being in control of the mega-pixels is important will be provided. Campers will be introduced to the tools in *Photoshop Elements* such as cloning, adding graphics to images, photo-merging faces and group shots. Skills learned will move campers away from static presentations created with software like *PowerPoint* to media rich 21<sup>st</sup> century presentations using *Photoshop Elements*. In addition, campers will take home a copy of *Photoshop Elements 8 for Windows*. This program retails for \$99, and our campers will get the software license for \$45. Don't have a digital camera and the required cable for uploading? We will provide cameras for use during camp. Program cost is \$150 if registered by 4/15; \$165 if registered after 4/15.
